Sid Brown (CEO of NFI)



Sidney R. Brown is the Chief Executive Officer of NFI, a premier integrated supply chain solutions provider and has locations across North America.

NFI employs more than 10,000 people across the globe and operates more than 4,000 trucks and 41.5 million sq. ft. of warehouse space. Revenues are on track to reach nearly \$2 billion and the company is well positioned to continue its explosive growth.

Sid is currently a Board Member of J&J Snack Foods, FS Energy and Power Fund, and a member of the Board of Trustees of Cooper Health System. From 1990 to 2017 Sidney served in various capacities with Sun National Bank, including Chairman, acting President, and CEO. He has also previously served on the Boards of Beth El Synagogue and Moorestown Friends. Sidney is a 2016 recipient of the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award.

In 1979, Sid graduated from Georgetown University with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration. He began his career as a financial analyst with Morgan Stanley in New York City. In 1983, Sid received his Master of Business Administration from Harvard University before joining NFI. b

Patricia (Trish) Wellenbach is the President and CEO of Please Touch Museum, an internationally recognized leader in integrating play and early childhood learning. She was selected as the CEO based on her demonstrated experience in managing complex organizations undergoing transformational change and creating business models that assures long-term sustainability for those businesses.

Prior to Please Touch Museum, Trish was CEO of Green Tree School & Services (a private school and behavioral health agency), Sandcastle Strategy Group, LLC (a management consulting services firm which she founded in 2007), and the Managing Director for Business Development and Strategy for Granary Associates, an international master planning, architectural design, and project management company. Trish was also the Executive Director of The Wellness Community of Philadelphia (now the Cancer Support Community).

Trish sits on the board of StoneMor Partners LP and Thomas Jefferson University. She also serves

on the Philadelphia Mayor's Cultural Advisory Board.

Wellenbach has been honored with multiple awards, including the City and State PA Above and Beyond Award, Women of Tomorrow Distinguished Leader award, the Girl Scouts Take the Lead award, and a Philadelphia Business Journal Woman of Distinction.

A cum laude graduate of Boston College School of Nursing, Wellenbach also holds a certificate from the UCLA Anderson School of Management's Healthcare Executive Program.

Hal Yoh, CEO of Day & Zimmermann



Hal Yoh is chair and chief executive officer of Day & Zimmermann, a leader in construction & engineering, staffing and defense solutions for leading corporations and government agencies around the world. He is the third generation of the Yoh family to lead Day & Zimmermann—a family-owned business and former recipient of the U.S. National Family Business of the Year award.

As chairman and chief executive officer since 1999, Hal has helped shape the strategic growth that the company has achieved over the last few decades. He began his career with Westinghouse Electric Corporation as a design engineer and project manager. In 1986, Hal rejoined Day & Zimmermann and held a range of progressive leadership roles including business area manager for the engineering and construction division and president of an affiliate company, senior vice president of Day & Zimmermann International, Inc. and as president of the process and industrial division.

Hal is active in many industry and professional associations. He currently serves as a board member of the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA) of which he was also past Chair. He is a member of the steering committee for the Defense Industry Initiative on Business Ethics & Conduct. In 2013, Hal was inducted into the National Academy of Construction.

As a strong proponent of civic and community service, Hal was recently appointed Chair, Philadelphia Airport Advisory Board, and currently serves as a Trustee of the Franklin Institute, and an executive committee member and past chair of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. He also has served as a past board member of WHYY.
